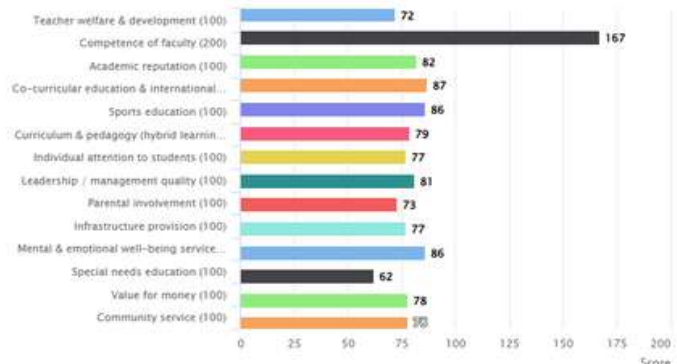

When parenting is driven by fear, children may internalize these anxieties as they get implanted deep down and they grow up with-

- Doubts
- Self-doubt
- Assumptions
- Judgments
- Low self-esteem



As parents, our goal is to nurture our children with care, fostering their growth, confidence, and independence. However, there are moments when our nurturing can unintentionally be influenced by fears—fear of loss, failure, or potential harm.

These fears often stem from past experiences, external incidents, or concerns we observe in others. While we may believe that overprotectiveness equates to love and safety, it's important to recognize how this mindset can affect our children.



In contrast, when we nurture with care and confidence, our purpose becomes clear. We focus on guiding our children with values, encouraging their decision-making, and helping them develop a sense of responsibility. A child who is raised with care, rather than fear, learns to distinguish between safe and unsafe situations. For instance, they understand that while school is a safe environment where constant monitoring is unnecessary, being aware of their surroundings in a busier setting, like walking to get groceries, may need a tracking system for the adult at home.

By empowering our children, they grow confident in knowing when to speak up, when to flag an issue, and how to collaborate for positive outcomes. As parents, we have the power to nurture them in a way that overcomes fears and promotes resilience. The journey becomes much more fulfilling when the message at home and at the school, work in harmony to support a child's emotional and mental growth.

By reflecting on how we nurture our children, we can ensure that we are building a foundation of care, love, and empowerment that helps them thrive in a world of possibilities.

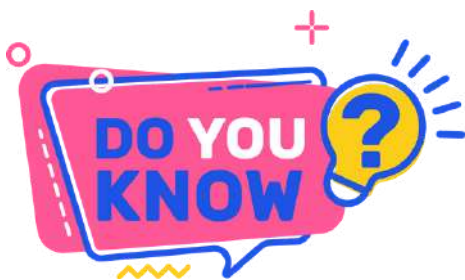


“Fund raising by Primary grades for animal welfare”

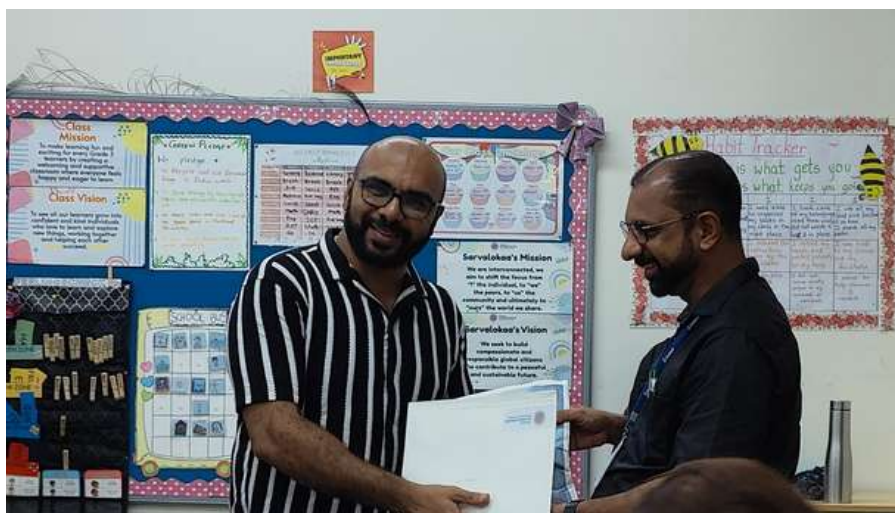

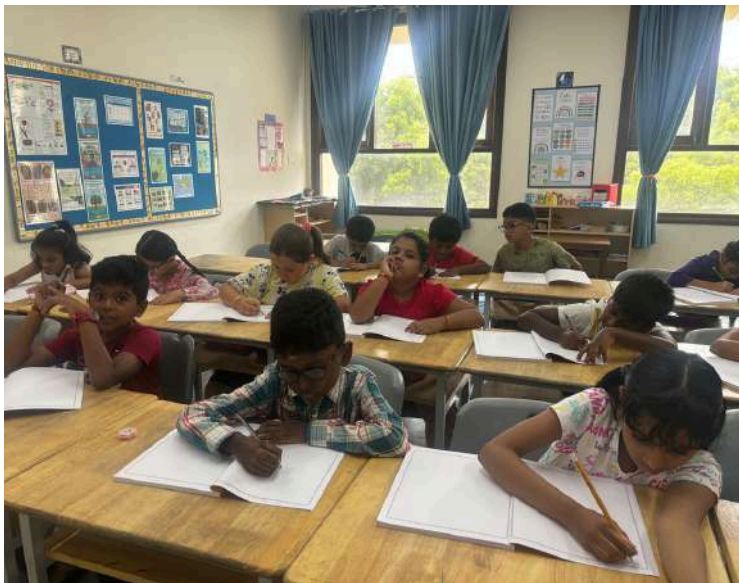
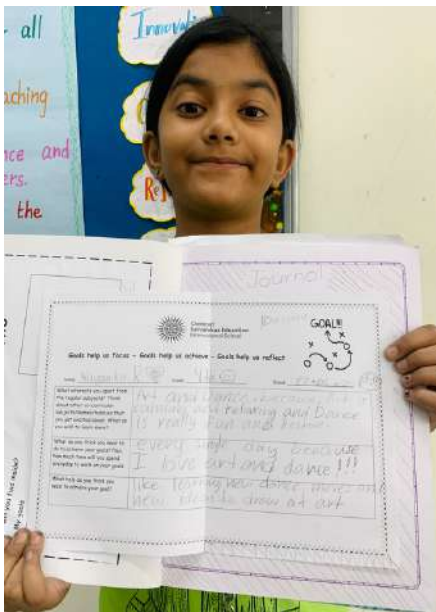


Goal Setting - Focus, Achieve, Reflect

Learner-Led Conferences at Sarvalokaa

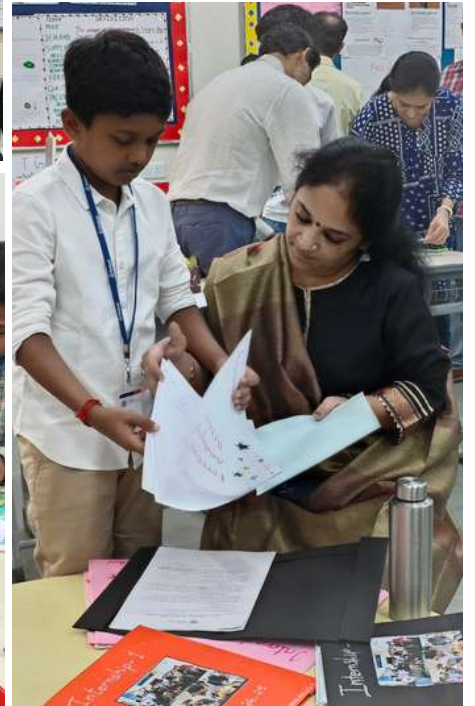

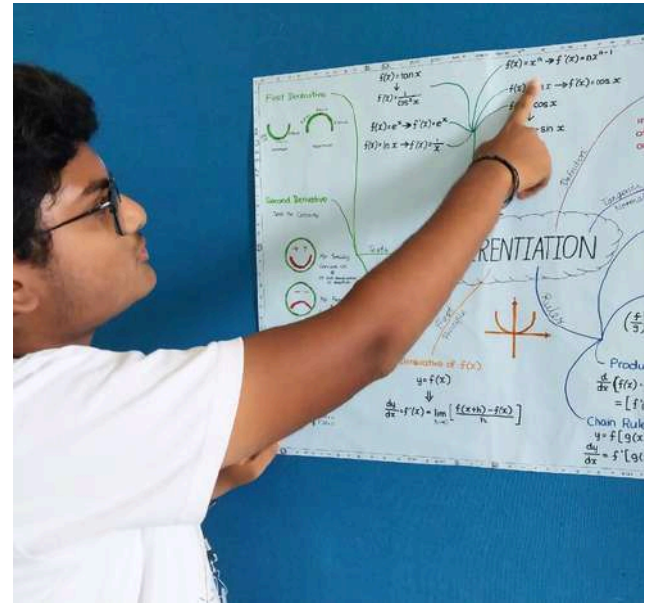


When Experience is the Teacher !

Experiential learning emphasizes that true understanding occurs when learners actively engage with the material and connect it to real-life contexts.

For instance, playing carrom board can illustrate the laws of reflection and geometry, while constructing a flower bed helps students grasp concepts like prisms, surface area, and volume. Basketball offers a practical way to explore parabolic curves and equations. Engaging with sequences and investigations builds critical skills, and observing patterns in nature reinforces these concepts.

Our educational philosophy integrates these experiences, fostering deeper learning by linking abstract principles to tangible, real-world applications, thereby enhancing comprehension and retention.





Our Lost Cultural Heritage and Medicine!



As part of their IGCSE Biology sevaa project, learners visited a nearby Irula tribe community, renowned for its cultural heritage and expertise in traditional medicine and sustainable practices. This visit deepened empathy, broadened perspectives, and encouraged students to appreciate indigenous knowledge while exploring meaningful ways to support the community.



Helmet Awareness Safety Program



Recognizing the need for helmet safety under the Motor Vehicles Amendment Act, 2019, Grade 8 learners explored this issue through discussions, surveys, and hands-on activities. They examined reasons people avoid helmets, assessed the risks, and created a video on helmet benefits. Exam Cell Speaks



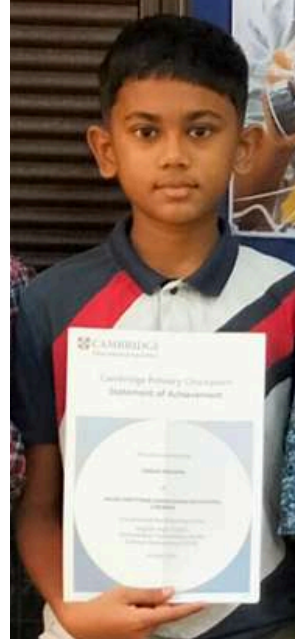

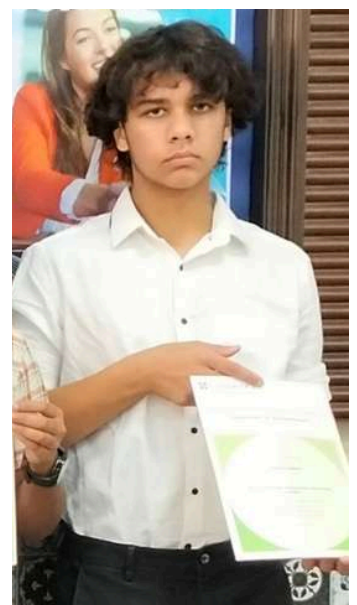
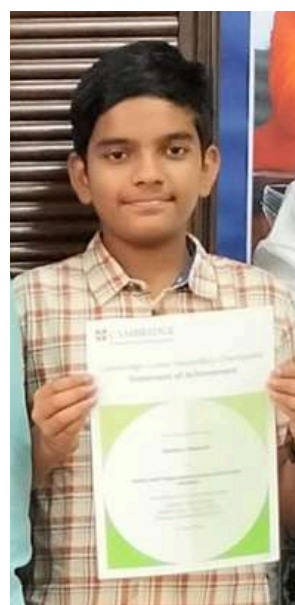
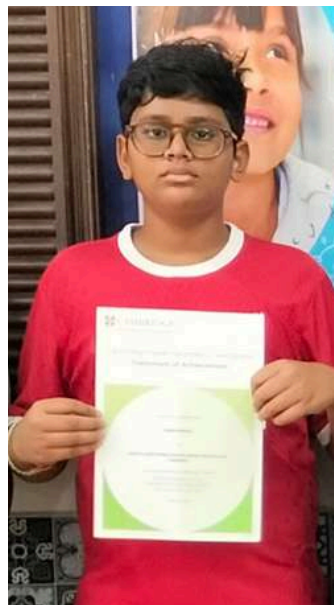
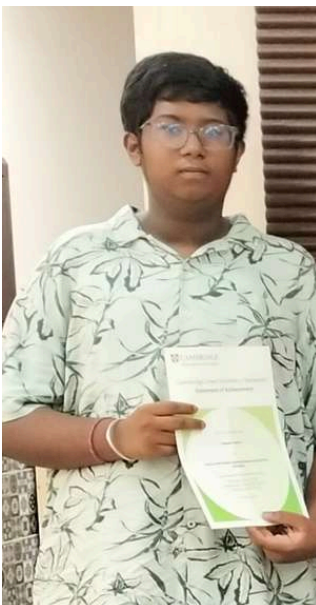
The term-end examinations for grades 5 to 9 and the first preliminary examinations for grade 10 and AS Level are scheduled for November 2024.

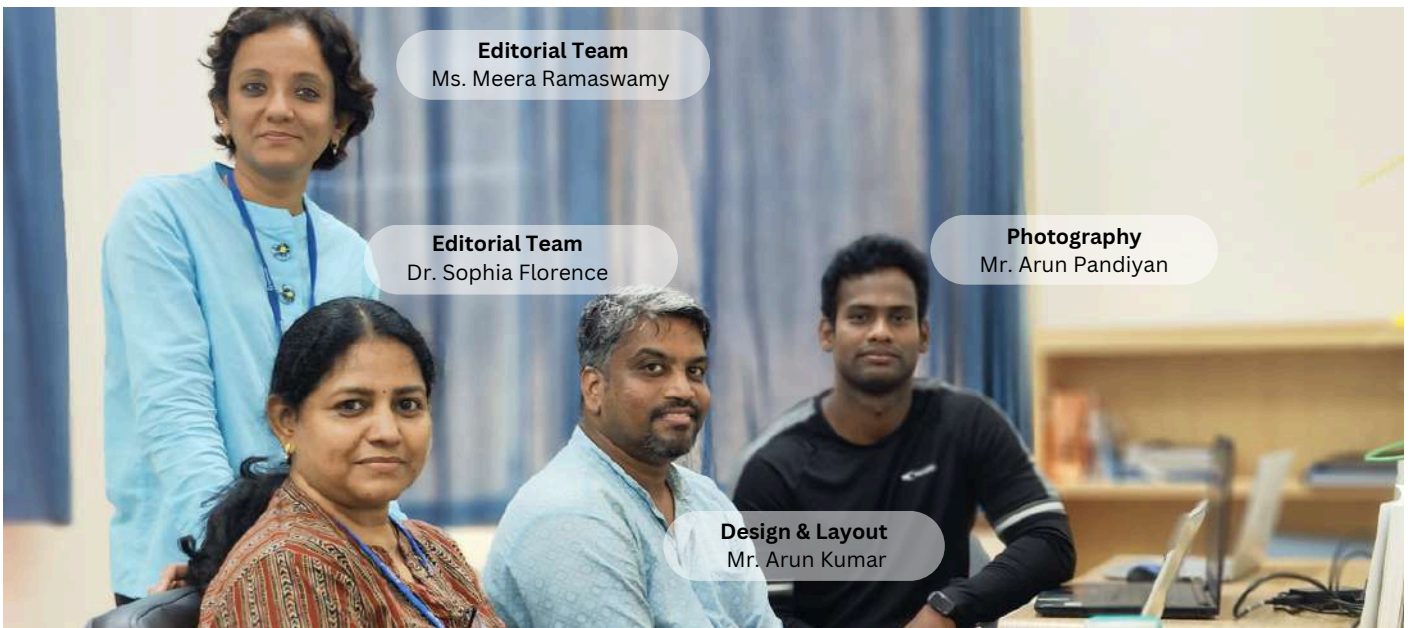
